Topic: – The CIB is sponsoring a seminar on field testing of concrete and the proposed changes to the concrete section of the NYC DOB Code. Come and learn about these changes and join in the discussions.

Concrete technology is changing at a rapid rate, and these changes should influence the field tests performed and how they are interpreted. Specific topics to be discussed:

- Is the temperature of delivered and in-place concrete important?
- The importance and relevance of the slump test.
- Realistic tolerance for slump and air.
- Is the 90-minute rule for concrete in the concrete truck realistic or can it be exceeded?
- Are cylinders cured and tested in accordance with ASTM C-31 a good indication of in-place compression strength.
- Where should concrete be sampled on-site?

Come and get the opinion of others on these important testing issues. Join in the discussion with contractors, concrete producers, and engineers.

Some changes being proposed to the concrete section of the NYC DOB Code are:

- In-place temperature monitoring for high-strength and mass concrete.
- Certified concrete producers will be allowed to submit concrete mix proportions.
- Changes to submitted and approved mix proportions that do not require a new TR-3.
- Reduced number of cylinders to be tested and sampling frequency.
- Acceptance testing for shotcrete.
- Installers for adhesive anchors must be certified in 2013.
- Other changes.

Hear what is being proposed to be changed in the code and why.
